






PREFACE










MALARIA SUNDAY, APRIL 26



Malaria is a preventable treatable disease spread through the bite of an infected mosquito. The disease claims the life of a child every 60 seconds. Malaria was virtually eliminated from the United States in 1951, but it remains a major health concern in more than 100 countries worldwide. To most of us in the United states, mosquitos are nothing more than a nuisance. But many countries in Africa just one bite from an infected mosquito could transmit malaria and lead to death. A bed net treated with long-lasting insecticide, coupled with training and education on how it is used, helps ensure that families are protected from this life-threatening disease as they sleep.


On the counter in the hallways outside the pastor's office is a SHAREHOLDER'S LETTER, this is a great opportunity for



A letter from New England Synod Bishop Hazelwood was printed in last week's bulletin and copies are available on the counter outside the Pastor's office regarding the Call process at FELC.

On Thursday, April 23 Bishop Hazelwood, along with his associate, Rev. Sara Anderson will meet with the Congregation Council and the Call Committee to discuss the process, where we are and where we are going in the search for the right pastoral leadership going forward.

We ask that you keep the Council & Call Committee in your prayers as they move forward in this process.

Next Sunday at the 9 am Service The Rt. Rev. Alan M. Gates, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts will bring greetings and deliver the sermon to us as he is here to visit with Grace Chapel later in the morning. Following is Bishop gates' biography:



Alan McIntosh Gates was born in Springfield, Mass., on March 25, 1958, the son of J. Edward Gates, a lexicographer, and Marion McIntosh (Thompson) Gates, a psychiatric nurse. He was baptized on July 13, 1958, at the First Presbyterian Church of Springfield, Mass., by his grandfather, the Rev. Dr. John A. Gates. He is a graduate of Middlebury College, Middlebury, Vt. His studies included a semester in Moscow, USSR, in the late Soviet era. Prior to seminary he was a Russian language translator, researcher and intelligence analyst for the U.S. Department of Defense, from 1980 to 1984, including a tour of duty at the State Department from 1982 to 1983. Concurrently he undertook graduate studies in linguistics at Georgetown University.

Bishop Gates holds a Master of Divinity degree from Episcopal Divinity School in Cambridge, Mass., and served while a seminarian at St. Stephen's Memorial Church in Lynn, Mass. He was ordained to the diaconate on June 13, 1987, at Washington National Cathedral, and to the priesthood on March 26, 1988, in the Diocese of Massa-

chusetts. He served as curate at the Parish of St. John the Evangelist in Hingham, Mass., from 1987 to 1990, and as rector of Trinity Church in Ware, Mass., in the Diocese of Western Massachusetts, from 1990 to 1996. While in the Diocese of Western Massachusetts, he was a member of the Commission on Ministry and the Adult Education Commission and served as dean of the Franklin-Hampshire Deanery (1993-1996).

He was then called to the Diocese of Chicago, where he served as senior associate rector (1996-2003) and priest-in-charge (2003-2004) at the Church of the Holy Spirit in Lake Forest, Ill. He was clergy caucus co-convener for Lake County United on interfaith action (2002-2004) and served on the board of St. Leonard's House, an Episcopal ministry for ex-offenders (1999-2003).

In 2004 he was called to the Diocese of Ohio, where he served as rector of St. Paul's Church in Cleveland Heights until his election as bishop in 2014.

While in the Diocese of Ohio, Bishop Gates was a founding strategy team member for Greater Cleveland Congregations on interfaith action, and was a member and chair of the diocese's Commission on Ministry and a member of the Standing Committee. He also served on numerous ministry discernment committees. He was a member of the preaching conference faculty in 2008 for the Episcopal Preaching Foundation, and served on the board of the Teleios Foundation for U.S.-Russian church relations (1996-2005).

Bishop Gates was elected bishop of the Diocese of Massachusetts at a special Diocesan Convention held on April 5, 2014, at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Boston. He was ordained and consecrated a bishop on Sept. 13, 2014, and on that day succeeded Bishop M. Thomas Shaw, SSJE to become the 16th bishop of the Diocese of Massachusetts. He serves on the board of Bexley Hall Seabury-Western Seminary Federation, having served as a Bexley Hall Seminary trustee (2010-2013) and governance chair (2011-2013). Bishop Gates and his spouse, Patricia J. Harvey, reside in Boston and have two adult sons.
