


Ron Newman has been driving faithfully for several years now and occasionally needs a break. We appreciate all that Ron has done and continues to do but we don't want to wear him out.




The day will start with the traditional church service at First Lutheran at 8:00 and 9:00 am and/or you can join us for church with Communion at the picnic from 11:00-12:00.






WANT TO HELP THE YOUTH OF BROCKTON?

First Evangelical Lutheran, Grace Chapel, and others are partnering to build the Boys' and Girls' Brigade, an inter-denominational, multi-cultural Christian youth organization that aims to provide love, spirituality, discipline, and a sense of belonging to the youth of Brockton, many of whom are "at risk" or from an "underprivileged" background. We have about 25 young people who have been meeting regularly, and dozens more on our roster who've expressed interest.

By positively intervening in the lives of young people now, we can dramatically reduce the social problems troubling Brockton—gangs, poverty, crime, and prostitution, for example—in the future. We believe that the kids we work with now will grow to become pillars of the community. You can help make that happen.

Over the past four years, the Brigade has been able to provide kids with time to play, Bible lessons, cooking lessons, sports activities, and a lot more. We sent five of our young people to summer camp in New Hampshire in July – without charge. Two others went to the SOUL Conference in Utah, also without charge. For most of these kids, this was their first time away from home, and away from Brockton. They report that it was a positive, life changing experience.

The only thing holding us back is the number of volunteers we have. We need people for a variety of tasks: teachers for younger children, discussion group facilitators for teens, coaches, artists who can teach, chaperones/shepherds, people who can do administrative work, drivers, and more—whatever your talents are, they will be welcomed. The Brigade meets on Saturdays, but we can use your help at other times as well, if this day does not work for you.

CROWD MANAGERS NEEDED



Since the tragic Station Nightclub fire in Rhode Island in 2003 various laws have been enacted to manage crowds in public gathering places.

These laws and ordinances have been adopted and enforced by states and municipalities around the nation and Brockton is no different.

As a church with gather space for large events and also the owner of a gym that is used for gatherings we are expected to conform to the guidelines of the law.

To this end, we need Certified Crowd Managers at all functions (except church services) where more than 100 people are gathered.

We are seeking members of the congregation to become certified in this role. It's a simple on line certification process.

At church events, such as concerts, dinners etc. we will be looking for Crowd Managers who are volunteers. At Fruth Center events where it is a non-church event we are looking for Crowd Managers that will be compensated for their time at an hourly rate yet to be determined. One manager per 100 people is required.

The basic responsibilities of the Crowd manager are to be sure the crowd does not exceed the capacity of the space, that all entrances are kept clear and that all fire pull stations are kept clear. Additionally to make safety announcements to the crowd at the beginning of an event and to point out emergency exits and procedures.

Part of that responsibility is in helping our Pastor to gain, and quickly I assume, a level of familiarity of our new operational organization of Council and commissions. This fall, September 14 - October 26 a new and upgraded WDD (Week-Day Discipleship Development program) is being offered to Pr. Jeff, Congregational Council members, Commission members and Congregation members for orienting and clarity about how we are developing our Mission and Ministry activities.

NEW BOOK

**Have you ever wondered,
“What is a Food Packaging Event all about?”**

A brief way of thinking about it is, some people gather in a place and put dried food in plastic packages. This particular food is then donated to food pantries for hungry people.

Many of these packages have been distributed through our Food For Friends Food Pantry. They are a popular commodity among many of our clients. One package of Rice & Beans or Mac & Cheese, when cooked in water expands to provide meals for six people. The contents are designed to be both nutritious and tasty.

END HUNGER NE is the source for the food in bulk form, thus the task of making family sized packages. Friends of the hungry donate the funds to purchase the large quantity in bulk form. This is a ministry to feed the hungry by circumventing the commercial providers and be able to make it cost effective in the food donation channels.

Cost reduction is enhanced by volunteers doing the hand work process of packaging. The next Food Packaging Event in our locale is this August 31st here in our Fruth Center. In this case the labor donation is contributed by Stonehill College students in a ‘Day of Service’ project. While the students will be doing the work any of us so motivated may contribute toward the cost.

BOOK OF FAITH returns Sunday, September 27th at the Sunday School Hour, 10:15 a.m.

On opening Sunday we will be starting our journey of faith at Matthew Chapter 7. This particular chapter is the last one of the three, 5, 6, 7, that are known as the Sermon on the Mount. Most likely, these three chapters are a collection of Jesus teachings on the new way of life he was instituting for those who love and follow God. We have found that Jesus emphasis is on his sense of all relationships between people and God. These teachings are in contrast to the laws of the religious leaders of the time that were stated in the negative.
